If inhaled

SECTION 12: Ecological information

12.1 **Toxicity**

- Toxicity to algae: EC50 Pseudokirchneriella subcapitata (previous names: Raphidocelis subcapitata, Selenastrum capricornutum) -> 100 mg/L - 72 h.

12.2 Persistence and degradability

At 100 ppm shikimic acid, the oxygen uptake by selected aerobic bacteria of the genera Pseudomonas, Flavobacterium, Achromobacter, and Xanthomonas (obtained from garden soil, compost, and sediment from a waste lagoon of a petroleum refinery catalytic cracking plant) inoculated in a mineral salt medium was approximately 150 ul after 120 minutes(1). Benthic microorganisms isolated from two types of bottom sediment of eutrophic Lake Jeziorak in Poland were able to utilize shikimic acid as a source of carbon(2).

12.3 Bioaccumulative potential

An estimated BCF value of 0.74 was calculated for shikimic acid(SRC), using an experimental water solubility of 1.5X10+5 mg/l(1,SRC) and a recommended regression-derived equation(2). According to a classification scheme(3), this BCF value suggests that bioconcentration in aquatic organisms is low(SRC).

12.4 Mobility in soil

The Koc of shikimic acid is estimated as approximately 6(SRC), using a measured water solubility of 1.5X10+5 mg/l(1) and a regression-derived equation(2,SRC). According to a recommended classification scheme(3), this estimated Koc value suggests that shikimic acid is expected to have very high mobility in soil(SRC).

Product

The material can be disposed of by removal to a licensed chemical destruction plant or by controlled incineration with flue gas scrubbing. Do not contaminate water, foodstuffs, feed or seed by storage or disposal. Do not discharge to sewer systems.

Contaminated packaging

Containers can be triply rinsed (or equivalent) and offered for recycling or reconditioning. Alternatively, the packaging can be punctured to make it unusable for other purposes and then be disposed of in a sanitary landfill. Controlled incineration with flue gas scrubbing is possible for combustible packaging materials
