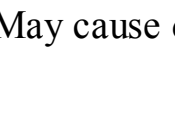

4.1 Description of first aid measures

General advice


